Original Alignment




Project Overview

- Processed as a consolidated Coastal Permit, Originally County File CPH17-0003
- Site was previously armored to slow erosion
- Prior to 1990 over 20 houses sat along the bluff
- Today fewer than half remain, more are lost or uninhabitable with each passing storm season
- 15 years of work culminated in this project, the most substantial push since workshops around 2015




Project Constraints and Challenges
